Individuals may also register to vote through the mail. Mail-in registration forms are available at most post offices, banks, and libraries. A voter registration form is also available on the Election Commissioner's web site which may be downloaded, printed and mailed to the Election Commissioner's office. Mail-in voter registration applications must be post marked no later than Friday, April 17, 2015, in order to be effective for the May 5th Lincoln City General Election.

Citizens may also register to vote at the Election Commissioner's Office, 601 North 46th Street, through Friday, April 24th. The office will be open weekdays from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. through Thursday, April 23rd and will be open from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. on Friday, April 24th.
