## **Election Commissioner Announces Voter Registration Sites**

LINCOLN -- The Lancaster County Election Commissioner will conduct voter registration at three sites from April 22<sup>nd</sup> to April 25<sup>th</sup>. Any Nebraska resident who will be 18 on or before November 4, 2014, has moved, changed his or her name, or would like to change their political party affiliation, may register to vote at the following times and locations:

Individuals may also register to vote through the mail. Mail-in registration forms are available at most post offices, banks, and libraries. A voter registration form is also available on the Election Commissioner's web site which may be downloaded, printed and mailed to the Election Commissioner's office. Mail-in voter registration applications must be post marked no later than Friday, April 25, 2014, in order to be effective for the May 13<sup>th</sup> Primary Election.

Citizens may also register to vote at the Election Commissioner's Office, 601 North 46<sup>th</sup> Street, through Friday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. The office will be open weekdays from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. through Thursday, May 1<sup>st</sup> and will be open from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. on Friday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>.
