APPLICANT CERTIFICATION: By signing this statement, the applicant certifies that:

1. It is capable of carrying out the proposed project in a competent manner, including by demonstrating that the eligible entity has the financial, technical and operational capability to carry out the proposed project and operate the resulting middle mile broadband network.
2. The proposed project will, upon completion, be capable of supporting retail broadband service.
3. It will commit to a non-federal cost share of no less than 30 percent of the total project cost. Or, if a Tribal government or Native entity, that it has sought or will seek a waiver of this requirement
4. It commits to prioritizing one of the following funded via the middle mile network:
 - a. Connecting middle mile infrastructure to last mile networks that provide or plan to provide broadband service to households in unserved areas;
 - b. Connecting non-contiguous trust lands; or
 - c. The offering of wholesale broadband service at reasonable rates on a carrier-neutral basis.
5. It will offer interconnection in perpetuity, where technically feasible without exceeding current or reasonably anticipated capacity limitations, on reasonable rates and terms to be negotiated with requesting parties. Such interconnection must include both the ability to connect to the public internet and physical interconnection for the exchange of traffic.
