8. General purpose for grant: (2-3 sentences)  
This project seeks to support and strengthen collaborations between arts-based organizations and juvenile justice systems to develop, expand, or enhance effective interventions that provide access to high-quality art programs with and for justice-involved youth.

9. Attach a one page summary of grant.  
Under this proposal, LUX Center for the Arts professional teaching artists will provide 54, 2-hour hands-on visual artmaking workshops with justice-involved youth at Hope Spoke, and 36, 1-hour hands-on artmaking workshops with incarcerated youth at the Lancaster County Youth Services Center. These arts programs provide an alternative language for self-expression that teach justice-involved youth constructive ways to communicate their emotions and needs.

The curriculum is tailored to be age, skill, and location appropriate. Lessons for incarcerated youth cover painting, drawing, and printmaking. Lessons for non-incarcerated youth can include ceramics and other media. Depending on the artist

teaching the workshop, they select and write lessons that stem from their area of expertise. Equipment and supplies are transported to the host site's classroom. Groups of up to 15 students work with LUX teaching artists during each workshop.
