RESOLUTION NO. R-23-0037

WHEREAS, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 13-510, provides, in relevant part:

Whenever during the current fiscal year or biennial period it becomes apparent to a governing body that due to unforeseen emergencies there is temporarily insufficient money in a particular fund to meet the requirements of the adopted budget of expenditures for that fund, the governing body may by a majority vote, unless otherwise provided by state law, transfer money from other funds to such fund. No expenditure during any fiscal year or biennial period shall be made in excess of the amounts indicated in the adopted budget statement, except as authorized in section 13-511, or by state law.

WHEREAS, during the current fiscal year it has become apparent that due to unforeseen emergencies there are insufficient funds in the General Fund ROD Technology and Election Commissioner Budgets to meet necessary expenditures;

WHEREAS, those unforeseen emergencies are increases in software maintenance costs and voting expenses not in each respective agency’s adopted budget;

WHEREAS, careful study has been made of funds needed for necessary expenditures for the remainder of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, sufficient funds were appropriated in the General Fund Miscellaneous Budget as a source for obtaining funds to provide additional appropriations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Lancaster County, Nebraska, that an appropriation transfer in the amount of \$136,830 be and hereby is transferred from the General Fund Miscellaneous Budget to the following General Fund Budgets:

ROD Technology \$ 21,830
Election Commissioner \$115,000
