

Voter ID Information

- Takes effect April 1, 2024, meaning the first election it will be used for is the May 14, 2024 State Primary

In Person Voters

- Voters must show an ID with a photo and name
- Voters can use an ID issued by:
 - o Federal government (including US Passport)
 - o State of Nebraska (driver's license/state ID)
 - o Nebraska colleges (any postsecondary institution, public or private)
 - o Local governments in Nebraska (counties, etc.)
 - o Nebraska public schools
 - o Military/veteran IDs
 - o Recognized Native American Tribal IDs
 - o Patient records w/ photos from nursing homes/assisted living/hospitals
- Expired documents will be accepted
- Documents that are NOT VALID include:
 - o Out of state driver's license/state ID
 - o Student IDs from out of state institutions
 - o Birth certificate
 - o Social Security card
 - o IDs from private organizations
 - o Any ID without photo
- Voters without an ID will be allowed to vote provisionally but must show a valid ID to election officials by the Tuesday after the election

Vote By Mail

- Applications will need to be submitted containing driver's license/state ID number, or a photocopy of an acceptable ID document, or a copy of their reasonable impediment certification

Voters with no ID

- Voters who cannot afford one will be allowed to receive a free state ID for voting purposes. For more info, visit www.dmv.nebraska.gov/DL/state-identification-card
- If a voter needs a state birth certificate to obtain a state ID for voting purposes, one can be obtained from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services at www.dhhs.ne.gov/Pages/Vital-Records.aspx or 402-471-2871.
- Voters with a reasonable impediment to showing an ID could be exempt
 - o Reasons for exemption could be:
 - Religious objection to being photographed
 - Cannot get an ID due to disability, illness, or lack of birth certificate
- Voters can complete a reasonable impediment certification at:
 - o Election Office if voting early
 - o Polling place on election day
 - o Secretary of State's website

Military and Overseas Voters (UOCAVA)

- Exempt from the new Voter ID requirements
