WHEREAS, 4-H grows true leaders — confident, caring and contributing young people with skills for life, such as problem solving, responsibility and citizenship; and



WHEREAS, 4-H provides experiences where youth learn by doing in areas such as science, citizenship, healthy living, agricultural literacy and career development; and


WHEREAS, 4-H is delivered by University of Nebraska–Lincoln Extension in cooperation with Lancaster County.




