BALLOT ISSUES

PROPOSED CITY OF LINCOLN CHARTER AMENDMENT-ARTICLE IX, SECTION 27

Shall Article IX, Section 27 of the Charter of the City of Lincoln be amended to correct typographical errors and make mayoral reference gender neutral?

PROPOSED CITY OF LINCOLN CHARTER AMENDMENT-ARTICLE IV, SECTION 12; ARTICLE VII, SECTION 2; AND ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 5

Shall Article IV, Section 12; Article VII, Section 2; and Article VIII, Section 5 of the Charter of the City of Lincoln be amended to increase the bid threshold from \$25,000.00 to \$50,000.00; to remove the requirement of three informal bids for contracts lower than \$50,000; to use the term "Rebid" instead of "Readvertise"; and to add the word "Responsive" to lowest responsible bidder?

CITY OF WAVERLY, NEBRASKA PROPOSAL TO INCREASE LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX RATE

Shall the governing body of the incorporated municipality - the City of Waverly, Nebraska - increase the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (½%) from the current rate of one percent (1%) to a rate of one and one-half percent (1½%) and impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate for a period of sixteen (16) years upon the same transactions within such municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax?

A "Yes" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor of increasing such local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (½%) to a rate of one and one-half percent (1½%), then the governing body of such incorporated municipality - the City of Waverly - shall be empowered as provided by Section 77-27,142 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes and shall forthwith proceed to increase the local sales and use tax rate from one percent (1%) to one and one-half percent (1½%) and, for a period of sixteen (16) years, impose a sales and use tax at the increased rate upon the same transactions within such municipality on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, pursuant to the Local Option Revenue Act.

A "No" Vote: If a majority of those voting on the question shall be opposed to such an increase of the local sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (½%), then the governing body of the incorporated municipality shall not impose such a tax increase and the local sales and use tax rate will remain unchanged at one percent (1%).

Additional Information Regarding Proposed Local Sales and Use Tax Rate Increase:

Revenues from the increased sales and use tax are available to be used for the general purposes of the City. If the proposed new aquatic center project is approved by the voters at this election, the revenues from the increased sales and use tax will be used to pay debt service on bonds issued to fund the costs of the new aquatic center project.

CITY OF WAVERLY PROPOSAL TO ISSUE AQUATIC CENTER BONDS

Shall the City of Waverly, Nebraska, borrow money and pledge the property and credit of the City upon its negotiable bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$3,500,000) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new aquatic center and related improvements for the City on land currently owned by the City; said bonds to be dated and become due and payable, both principal and interest, on such date or dates as may be fixed by the Mayor and Council of the City at the time of their issuance and to bear interest at such rate or rates as shall be determined by the Mayor and Council of the City; and

Shall the City cause to be levied and collected annually, a special levy of taxes on the taxable value of all the taxable property in the City, and all other taxes, in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds, to the extent not paid from other sources, as such principal and interest become due?

A "Yes" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such questions shall be in favor of issuing bonds, the City shall construct and equip an aquatic center and related improvements and shall issue bonds in the principal amount of up to \$3,500,000 to pay for construction of the aquatic center and related improvements. The funds for repayment of the bonds will come from the proceeds of an increase in the City sales and use tax rate by an additional one-half of one percent (½%) from one percent (1%) to one and one-half percent (1½%) (if approved by the voters at this election), and, to the extent not paid from such sales and use tax, from an ad valorem tax on all the taxable property in the City.

A "No" Vote: If a majority of the votes cast upon such questions shall be against issuing bonds, the City shall not issue bonds to finance the construction of an aquatic center and related improvements. In such event, the aquatic center would not be constructed or would be constructed with funds from other sources and would not result in an ad valorem tax on all the taxable property in the City.

**VILLAGE OF DAVEY
SALES AND USE TAX ISSUE**

Shall the governing body of the Village of Davey, Nebraska, impose a sales and use tax of one and one half percent (1.50%) upon the same transactions within the Village of Davey on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, with the proceeds collected to be used for capital improvement including, but not necessarily limited to, city streets, city water and city sewage systems?

**VILLAGE OF ROCA, NEBRASKA
SALES AND USE TAX ISSUE**

In order to reduce the Village's reliance on property taxes, shall the governing body of the Village of Roca, Nebraska, impose a sales and use tax of one and one-half percent (1½%) upon the same transactions within the Village on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose such tax pursuant to the Nebraska Revenue Act of 1967, as amended; which sales and use tax shall be used for street repairs and other public infrastructure purposes, reduction of debt, and general operations of the Village of Roca?
