WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 23-174.10 (Reissue 2012), the County Board has authority to adopt regulations to promote the public health, safety and welfare, which shall apply to all of the county except within the limits of any incorporated city or village and except within the unincorporated area where a city or village has been granted zoning jurisdiction and is exercising such jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the Lancaster County Board of Commissioners adopted Regulations for the Operation of Body Art and Piercing Establishments in Lancaster County on February 25, 2003, under County Resolution No. R-03-0007 and on October 15, 2013, under County Resolution No. R-13-0063; and on August 9, 2016, under County Resolution No. R-16-0047; and on September 18, 2018 under County Resolution No. R-18-0060;

WHEREAS, the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department has recommended an amendment to increase permit fees for the operation of body art and piercing establishments, as provided in Attachment "A," attached hereto and incorporated by this reference; and

WHEREAS, on September 8, 2020, the Board of Commissioners of Lancaster County, Nebraska, conducted a public hearing regarding the adoption of the amendments to County Resolution No. R-18-0060, Regulation for the Operation of Body Art and Piercing Establishments, as provided in Attachment "A";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Lancaster County, the amendments to County Resolution No. R-18-0060, Regulation for the Operation of Body Art and Piercing Establishments, as provided in Attachment "A," are hereby adopted, and shall become effective September 8, 2020. These amendments shall supersede all previous amendments not in conformance herewith.



REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF BODY ART AND PIERCING ESTABLISHMENTS IN LANCASTER COUNTY, NEBRASKA

**SCHEDULE OF COSTS FOR SEPTEMBER 1, 2020 TO AUGUST 31, 2021**

**VI. Body Art Establishment; Permit Fees**

- (a) The fee for a body art establishment permit shall be as follows:

<u>Body Art Establishment</u>	<u>Initial</u>	<u>Renewal</u>
One (1) to five (5) stations	<del>\$460.00</del> \$470.00	<del>\$320.00</del> \$330.00
Each additional five (5) stations	<del>\$190.00</del> \$195.00	<del>\$150.00</del> \$155.00

(b) Any initial body art establishment permit issued after the December 31 and before May 15 shall pay 67% of the initial fee. Any initial body art establishment permit issued on or after May 15 and before July 1 shall pay the initial fee and such permit shall be valid until June 30 of the following year. Renewal of all body art establishment permits shall be as required in Section VIII. The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.

**XV. Body Art Practitioner Permit; Fees**

- (a) The fee for a body art practitioner permit shall be as follows:

Initial Fee	<del>\$100.00</del>	\$105.00
Renewal Fee	<del>\$60.00</del>	\$65.00

(b) The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.

**XXIX. Body Art Establishment or Practitioner Suspended Permit; Reinstatement Fee.**

Any person eligible for reinstatement as provided in Section XXVIII, shall pay a reinstatement fee of ~~\$225~~ \$230 for a body art establishment permit and \$55 for a practitioner permit in addition to any other applicable fees. The Health Director shall not reinstate the permit until the reinstatement fee is paid. The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.

**VI. Body Art Establishment; Permit Fees**

- (a) The fee for a body art establishment permit shall be as follows:

<u>Body Art Establishment</u>	<u>Initial</u>	<u>Renewal</u>
One (1) to five (5) stations	<del>\$470.00</del> \$480.00	<del>\$330.00</del> \$340.00
Each additional five (5) stations	<del>\$195.00</del> \$200.00	<del>\$155.00</del> \$160.00

(b) Any initial body art establishment permit issued after the December 31 and before May 15 shall pay 67% of the initial fee. Any initial body art establishment permit issued on or after May 15 and before July 1 shall pay the initial fee and such permit shall be valid until June 30 of the following year. Renewal of all body art establishment permits shall be as required in Section VIII. The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.

**XV. Body Art Practitioner Permit; Fees**

- (a) The fee for a body art practitioner permit shall be as follows:

Initial Fee	\$105.00
Renewal Fee	\$65.00

(b) The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.

**XXIX. Body Art Establishment or Practitioner Suspended Permit; Reinstatement Fee.**

Any person eligible for reinstatement as provided in Section XXVIII, shall pay a reinstatement fee of ~~\$230~~ \$235 for a body art establishment permit and \$55 for a practitioner permit in addition to any other applicable fees. The Health Director shall not reinstate the permit until the reinstatement fee is paid. The fees shall be payable to the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department and shall be credited to the Health Fund.
